DAWLEY,

WITH LAWLEY, LAWLEY BANK, MALINSLEE, HORSEHAY, LIGHTMOOR, AND NEIGHBOURHOOD.

DAWLEY, or **DAWLEY MAGNA**, is a thriving market town and populous parish, comprising the townships of **DAWLEY PARVA**, or Little Dawley, and **MALINSLEE**. The town is situate about 2 miles n. from Madeley, 4 w. by s. from Shiffnall, and 4 s. e. from Wellington.

The parish church of Holy Trinity is a handsome structure, of freestone, erected in 1845, at a cost of £3,000, raised by subscription, with grants from the Church building Society. The living is a perpetual curacy. There are chapels for Baptists, Wesleyan and Primitive Methodists, and two excellent schools—one conducted on the national, and the other on the British plan. The latter, situated at Pool Hill, was erected in 1844, by the Coalbrookdale Company, for the instruction of the children of the workpeople employed in their extensive works at Horsehay, Lightmoor, and neighbourhood. The town is lighted with gas, and has recently undergone considerable improvement. A very handsome and commodious market-hall has been erected in High street, at a cost of £2,140, which adds very much to the general appearance of the main street. The interior is well fitted with stalls and conveniences for butchers and other tradesmen. It is

built of red bricks with stone facings, giving it a light and elegant appearance. Colonel Slaney, who holds considerable property in the parish, has contributed a clock for the building, value £50. The first market was held here on the 18th May, 1867. The market is held on Saturday, and a fair yearly, on the 4th June, for horses, cattle, &c. The parish contained in 1841, 8,641 inhabitants; in 1851, 9,201; and in 1861, 11,013.

DAWLEY PARVA, or *Little Dawley*, is a township and new parish (for ecclesiastical purposes), taken from the parish of Dawley, under the late Sir Robert Peel's Act. The church, dedicated to St. Luke, is a neat structure, in the Norman style of architecture. The living is a perpetual curacy. The patronage is vested in the Crown and the Bishop of Lichfield alternately. The Wesleyans have a chapel. Population in 1861, 2,327.

MALINSLEE is a township, in the parish of Dawley, situate about 1 mile from the parish church; it is also an ecclesiastical district, taken from the parish of Dawley. The church, dedicated to St. Leonard, is an octagonal structure, erected in 1805. The living is a perpetual curacy, in the gift of the incumbent of Dawley. Population in 1861, 2,323.
